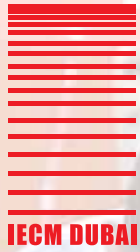

Testing Process:

1. >80% on a 50 question closed book test
2. Must perform the following skills / scenarios without continuous assistance:
 - a. Mouth-To-Mask;
 - b. Patient Assessment/Management;
 - c. Management of Foreign Body Airway Obstruction (Adult/Child, Infant) - Responsive and Unresponsive (if not required as prerequisite);
 - d. Adult CPR/AED (if not required as prerequisite)
 - e. Infant One - and Two-Rescuer CPR (if not required as prerequisite);
 - f. Bleeding Control/Shock Management (with or without supplemental emergency oxygen).
