Course Description:

The course aims at training students to solve some of the problems which face the translator in both the source language (Arabic) and the target language (English). The course deals with a number of issues and problems related to translation such as literal versus free translation, the limits of the translator's freedom, the issue of equivalence between the two languages and the two cultures and the impact of that on the transfer of meaning, concepts and style of translation.

The course deals with some of the grammatical, lexical, stylistic, and phonological problems. It also provides trainee translators with useful and practical solutions for these common problems The textbooks used for this course involves important issues related to translation practices such as difference in semantic range of two similarly produced lexicons, variation of equivalent lexicons in two languages, variation of partial classifications, linguistics necessities of expression, connotation and tone implications and variation in social and educational habits.
