Aims & objectives

This course deals with the fundamentals of expository writing based on general review of the English language for the non-native speakers. Extensive practice in writing expository essays focusing on the discovery and use of various linguistic devices which make an essay effective with stresses on English grammar, mechanics, and style. This course will also familiarize the student with the terminology used in the Health and Medical Sciences.

Upon successful completion, the student should be able to:

- 1. Read critically and evaluate literary selections and to apply the same techniques to the students own writing.
- 2. Write clear, Coherent writing style, which will be effective in accomplishing the purpose with the audience.
