

## CHART narrative

CHART narratives follow a visual layout based on the letters in the acronym. Starting with the chief **Complaint**, the **History** of the present illness, along with the patient's past medical history, is outlined. **Assessment** findings are then documented, along with **Rx** (prescriptions) that the patient is prescribed. Lastly is the **Treatment** section, which outlines what you've done for your patient.

ICHART is used for EMS documentation.

<b>I (Incident)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Brief details of the incident, including location and reason</li><li>• How the patient was found</li></ul>
<b>C (Chief Complaint)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Patient's age, gender and chief complaint</li></ul>
<b>H (History)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Brief history of events leading to the incident</li><li>• Mechanism of injury (MOI), if applicable</li><li>• SAMPLE</li></ul>
<b>A (Assessment)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• AVPU and OPQRST</li><li>• Important findings and results of physical exam</li><li>• Vital signs</li></ul>
<b>T (Treatment)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• List of treatments in chronological order</li></ul>
