Course Goals:

A student who successfully completes the course will have reliably the ability to acquire a basic rule for using words parts to form medical terms and the use of the correct phonetic pronunciation of the medical terms.

Goals for Student Learning:

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Discuss the four parts to medical terms.
- 2. Recognize the most common prefixes and suffixes and define word building.
- 3. Recognize the combining forms and suffixes related to all body systems and special topics "pharmacology, diagnostic imaging, surgery, oncology, mental health and rehabilitation services.
- 4. Define vocabulary, pathology, diagnostic and therapeutic medical terms related to all body systems.
- 5. Demonstrate verbal and nonverbal communication techniques to achieve effective interactions with peers, and instructors.

Course Requirements:

1. Quizzes (15%) – Dictation/Written and Oral Evaluation

Two quizzes will be given on scheduled weeks during the semester and will cover content that has been taught in class. Since the material in this course is cumulative, the quizzes may also require knowledge of all material studied in the course prior to the quiz. **There will be no make-up quizzes.** If a student is absent for a quiz, a grade of zero will be recorded. The lowest quiz score will be dropped. I will notify you in advance if any quiz dates will be changed.

2. Exams (Midterm Exam #1 = 30%; Final Exam = 40%)

Examinations will be given at scheduled class times during the semester. Exam content will be based upon material addressed in the assigned text, assigned readings, class assignments and inclass content. There are no make-up exams. Any exception should be discussed with me at least 48 hours in advance of the exam schedule.

3. Assignments (15%)

There will be 1 assignment to be completed during the semester. The assignments will be completed independently and submitted by the required due date. There will be no make-up assignments. If you do not submit the assignment by the required due date, a grade of zero will be recorded.
