## **Course Description:**

- Clinical practice II will especially focus on advanced airway
  management, medication administration, and patient assessment
  skills. It consists of scheduled clinical rotations at the Anesthesia
  Room, Respiratory therapy and IV Room. During this course, students
  will be prepared for the Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support
  Provider (ACLS) by the American Heart Association.
- It consists of scheduled clinical rotations including CCU and ER.

#### **Module Aims:**

- To provide students' the opportunity to undergo clinical and field rotations to safely practice skills and techniques learned till date with a special focus on the skills learned during current semester.
- To provide students' the ability to integrate patient assessment findings in formulating a field impression to implement a comprehensive treatment/disposition plan.

### **Indented Learning Outcomes (Objectives)**

At end of the course, student will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate proper use of basic & advanced airway management.
- 2. Perform safe administration of medications through enteral and parenteral routes.
- 3. Demonstrate Advances Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) Skills in a given simulated scenario (ACLS Course).
- 4. Work as an autonomous emergency care professional within the framework of scope of practice, legal and ethical requirements.
- 5. To show professional behavior towards the patient, folks of the patient, and co members of Health Care Team.
- 6. Apply the principals of professional documentations.
- 7. Perform comprehensive assessment of critically ill patients.
- 8. Fulfill the total skills completion number requirements as mentioned in program skill completion log.
- 9. Demonstrate the ability to write a critical care patient care report

#### Methods of evaluation:

Each Student will be evaluated based on the following criteria's:

#### Final Exam – 40 marks

- Practical & OSCE
  - Final Scenario Based Exam / Skills 20 marks
  - $\circ$  4 drugs -20 marks (5 marks for each)

#### **ACLS Course – 7 marks**

- 1<sup>st</sup> attempt − 7 marks (pass both written & practical)
- $2^{\text{nd}}$  attempt -5 marks (retake pass any one of the components)
- 3<sup>rd</sup> attempt − 2 marks (retake pass both components)
- Failed [retake course passed] 1 mark
- Failed or not shown
   0 mark [result Fail (need to repeat the semester/CP)]

Skills performed, Narratives, attendance & clinical case discussion – 53 marks.

Skills performed & attendance scoring [(3.5 marks/day X 14 weeks = 49 marks)] + Overall minimum numbers of skills achieved as mentioned below.

#### Skills Performed – minimum numbers of skills to be achieved:

- Cases = 14 (14 narratives were required)
- **Basic airway management** = 5 to performed
- Advanced airway management = 2 to performed & 3 to observed
- IV = 6 to performed & 6 to observed
- **Drug Administration** = 6 to be performed using parenteral route & 6 to observed
- Daily shift & skills marks distributed as the following: **2 marks** on clarifying the incident, chief complaint, patient's past medical history (SAMPLE), assessment (AVPU/OPQRST), and transportation decision (whether to other hospitals, or other sections within the same hospital such as OR, X-ray... etc.) in the written narrative. **1.5 marks** on clarifying the provided treatment and performed skills.
- At least one case on each shift with at least one skill to be performed. If there were no patients or no skill to be performed; then students should arrange another shift, and complete the requirements (to be within the same week).
- Daily attendance sheet and skills performed should match with each other
- 4 days & more absence repeat the whole course, based on university rule of 25% absence
- **Sick leave** from KKUH & Government hospitals / health units only (to be submitted within 1 week) and students has to make for the **miss** clinical practice by attending other day.



# Clinical case discussion scouring [Maximum 4 marks to ensure quality improvement and no improvement minimum zero marks]

### Clinical case discussion meeting:

- Attendance is mandatory (if not showing up, absence will be counted) 4 days & more absence repeat the whole course, based on university rule of 25% absence.
- An academic instructor will be assigned for each group of students (please check the attached table to identify your group, place, time & date of meeting)

#### Check point of each student - every 2 weeks

- Their attendance
- Narratives feedback for improvement

Final grades will be awarded following the formula listed below:
