Courses Taught:

- 2019- 2020. **E-Government** (a Postgraduate course for Public Administration Masters program at King Saud University). Developing basic skills in the field of information management for leaders in the public sector. It reviews the role of information systems in the decision-making process. The course also focuses on discussing the e-government role in raising and improving the performance of government agencies. It specifically includes a discussion of organizational foundations, information management systems, types of computer systems, decision-making support tools and analytical methods for implementing e-government with case studies of some governments in the application of e-government.
- 2019-2020. **E-Business** (an undergraduate course for MIS program at King Saud University). The course introduces the principles and concepts of e-commerce: the types of e-business solutions; planning and design of e-business solutions; e-business solutions in various business sectors; integrated information systems, the legal and ethical dimensions of e- business solutions; risk management in e-business solutions; new trends in e-business solutions; and cases studies in e-business solutions.
- 2019-2020. - **Co-op Training Course** (an undergraduate training course for MIS program at King Saud University). Cooperative Education is a planned learning experience, for which credits are earned, that integrates classroom theory and learning experiences at a workplace. The experience enables students to apply and refine the knowledge and skills acquired in a related curriculum course. The Co-op is a supervised work experience in a position in the government or the private sector which aimed to assist students in making the transition from the classroom to industry. Students are required to finish 320 hours on the job to earn 6-credit hours for the course.
- 2019-2020. **Decision Support System & Expert Systems** (an undergraduate course for MIS program at King Saud University). The course introduces students to the concepts of artificial intelligence and how to build an integrated decision support system. Topics covered include: methods for evaluating decision support systems, modeling and analysis of the development of decision support systems, data management, modeling, and user interface, the concepts of artificial intelligence and intelligent systems, including the evidentiary rules of the cases.
- 2019-2020. **Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP)** (an undergraduate course for MIS program at King Saud University). Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) systems are now the norm in all types of businesses. Familiarity with such systems is therefore essential both in its own right and as preparation for any future career in business. This course provides the students with a broad understanding of the fundamental concepts of ERP systems and explains their strategic, tactical, operational influences on businesses. It introduces the ERP functionalities and capabilities in contrast to the

unintegrated information systems. It defines the business functional areas, processes, ERP development history, and enabling technologies. It also discusses the pros and cons of implementing an ERP system and the benefits of Customer Relationship Management (CRM) software, Supply Chain Management (SCM) systems, and accounting and management-reporting as useful extensions of ERP software. In addition, it introduces the development of event process chain (EPC) diagrams of basic business processes and the development of processes improvement suggestions.

- 2017-2019. **Management Information Systems** (Undergraduate course for MIS program at Qassim University). This course discusses the strategic perspective of information systems, the implications of the interrelationships between organizations and information systems, information systems and work design, ERP systems, sources of information systems, management of IT projects, business intelligence and decision making.
- 2018-2019- **Essentials of Secretary and Administrative Communication**. This course is intended to be delivered to higher diploma students where this course focus on the role of Secretary in organizations and how they can deliver their work in a way to aid management by applying Information Technology in carrying Administrative Communication duties.
- 2016- 2019. **Introduction to Management Information Systems** (Undergraduate course for MIS program at Qassim University). This course covers the principles and concepts of management information systems, strategic use of information systems, business functions and supply chain, telecommunications networks, databases and Data Warehouses, the web enabled enterprise, the challenges of global information systems, decision support systems, expert systems and knowledge management and business information.
- 2016- 2018. **Introduction to Computer Concepts and Programming** (an undergraduate course for MIS program at Qassim University). This course aims to present the basics of programming languages. In the beginning, it introduces the machine language as well the base number conversion (binary, decimal, hex, octal). After that, it presents the programming languages levels of the methods used to convert the source program that is written by using comprehensible language near the human language into a goal program written in machine language ready to use. This course also provides a glimpse of the methods used in programming. The random programming is considered the oldest method and object-oriented programming is the most recent. Similarly, we focus on writing algorithms and flowchart in order to find a computerized solution to a particular problem. In the last, it presents an overview of the programming languages used in the dynamic and static website programming. So, it focuses on the static website programming language HTML and CSS.
- 2013-2014. **Information Systems for Management** (Seminar leader at the University of East Anglia). The course addresses the changing role of information technology and management information systems in organizations today. In particular, it examines the role of IT and MIS as competitive tools for all organizations and the role of IT as an essential enabler of innovation. It aims to provide an understanding of the use of information by modern organizations and an

understanding of concepts such as systems theory, data warehouses and electronic commerce.
